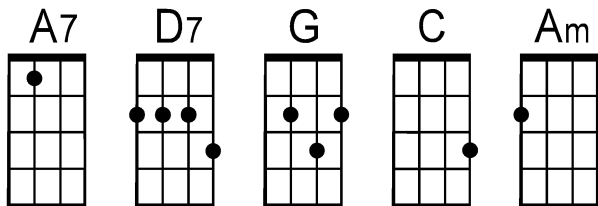


Jingle Bells
