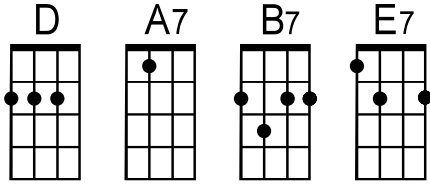


The Hukilau Song (Key of D)
