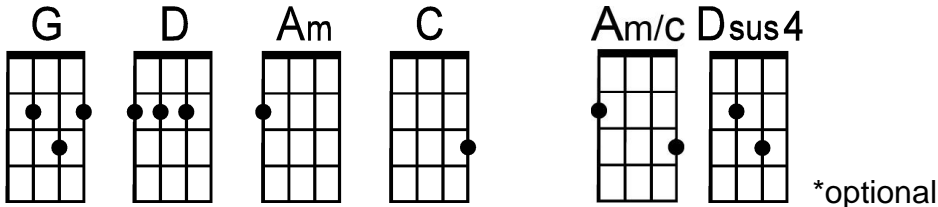


# Bonny Portmore
