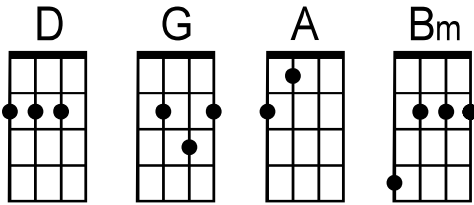


500 Miles (Key of D)
